

Introduction

The fourth annual Colorado Core Knowledge Summer Writing Institute was held at the Denver Public Library in Denver, Colorado, during the week of June 24-28, 2002. Sixty-three teachers and administrators participated, representing twenty schools from Denver and surrounding cities, as well as Colorado Springs, Pueblo West, Calhan, Paonia, Keenesburg, Granby, and Johnstown. Forty-three units were written for Pre-Kindergarten through Eighth Grade, as well as for Art and Music. A great deal of talent and enthusiasm was gathered during this week and the units produced exemplify this!

The teachers spent the first day learning how to write a Core Knowledge unit and writing concept objectives for their unit. The second day was spent identifying resources and researching the content.
